

U.S. Masonic Membership (millions)

I've been a Mason 3.500 since going through 3.000 my Craft degrees in 2.500 Scotland while on duty with the navy 1976-1.500 1979. Over the years, 1.000 everything concerning "membership" in the craft ... people crying



that we're doomed, others saying simply that it's a cyclic thing. I want you to take a CLOSE look at the graphic above. The numbers of members shown are taken from the Masonic Service Association page where they show membership by year. Their data stops in 2017, so the black bar above is what we call an "extrapolation" - meaning, if the curve continues at the same slope (rate), this shows where the membership numbers are headed. Again, looking at the graph, what strikes your eye are several key and essential points: in the late 1920's, we see a relative peak—probably associated with the returning WWI veterans joining lodges as some sort of way to relive that camaraderie they felt during the war with their buddies. Then, around 1939 you see a relative minimum—which presages WWII when our "boys" would be occupied fighting the war and were unavailable to join ... thus this probably represents the numbers dying off and going NPD (remember, the 30's were the great depression). Then, we see a huge peak around 1959-1960 (end of Korea, and again, major numbers joining to rekindle that camaraderie with their "brothers" in arms. But, from there, we see a constant and predictable downward trend in total members. If you follow the black line, it says basically we will have zero members around 2050. Reality is that you will never actually hit zero, as the

lodge, Grand Lodge, or whatever group you choose, will simply cease to be a viable organization long before you hit that magic "zero" date. You have to decide what the minimum number of members required to sustain the absolutely essential functions of the group might be in order to gain some perspective on when the group might actually just steal away into the night and cease to be viable.

Not shown in the graphic is the specific data for Colorado. Our 2016 membership numbers were reported to be 8,099 - while our 2017 membership numbers reported were 7,676 (representing a LOSS of 423 (or about –5.2%) members—from whatever cause ... death, NPD, demit, you name it). Looking at ALL Grand Lodges in the U.S. only Alabama (+551=+2.4%), Hawaii (+13=+0.8%), and Kentucky (+33=+0.1%) showed positive growth in their numbers. ALL the rest of the U. S. Grand Lodges lost significant numbers in just that one year span. By the way, our neighbors to the north (Canada) had NO provinces showing gains in membership. Their overall membership in the craft declined from 69,792 in 2016 to 65,956 in 2017. That's a loss of 3,836 members or ~5.5% - which is statistically about the same level of loss seen in the U.S.

Brothers, these are FACTS ... you can NOT argue facts. You may argue "opinions" all day and all night long, but facts are simply facts. You cannot deny from the numbers we see here that Masonry membership is on a decline and has been for nearly FIVE DECADES! The odd lodge here or there that seems to be growing doesn't offset the overall Grand Lodge losses—closure of lodges and loss of members that we're seeing.

That leads me to ask the question: WHY are we losing so consistently? Well, this is a simple question, but the problem it addresses is quite complex, so the answer will logically also be quite complex and perhaps difficult to understand and most likely unpopular to digest. One may argue that the current young generation simply isn't interested—they have different priorities and ideas about what they want to do with their PERSONAL time. That's actually be the case for years ... so that's not a real driver even though it's convenient to think so. As our late W.Bro. Randy Trullinger, 32° KCCH used to say about Job's Daughters (and it really applies to Masonry and the other bodies as well) "we do a great job of getting them to join; we do a LOUSY job at keeping them." I've seen Brother Chris Hodapp opine that "we're boring our members to death." There's a certain amount of truth to that statement. When a meeting becomes PREDICTABLE, REPETITIVE, and yes ... boring—you WILL lose members' interest and participation. When you recycle members through the line over and over again, you will burn them out—and lose them as well.

There is absolutely NOTHING we can do to stop losses from death of our members. But, as our membership ages, and we don't replace the losses with younger men having many years of potential productivity in the craft, the trend of losing overall membership will simply continue.

When I joined the Denver Consistory in 2003, we had approximately 5,000 members—according to then Secretary Darryl Tygart. Of those 5,000-ish members, ~2,500 (HALF) of them were 80 years old or older! Last time III. Bro. Matt provided our membership statistics, we had 1837 members. That was a one year loss of 107 members (5.5% - again, matching the overall Canadian and U.S. trends). But, that also represents a ~63% drop in about 16 yrs.

So, what does all this tell us? In the words of retired Admiral Mike Rogers (former Director of NSA and Chief of the Cyber Command) who was speaking to a veterans group on what was needed to attract the new generation of veteran to the group, "simply put, they are NOT going to come to you, YOU HAVE TO GO TO THEM." So, this brings me to the tradition of not asking men to join a lodge - the caveat is that the candidate is "unbiased by improper solicitation" which I interpret to mean, if there is such a thing as "improper" solicitation, there MUST then be "proper" solicitation for membership. We've opened up about the craft over the years - I guarantee you we can speak more openly about Masonry to outsiders than my father's generation (1930's) could, but apparently that's not working either. We're seeing pitifully small numbers participate in our Prospect Nights—why? Maybe we've pretty much exhausted the pool of eligible Master Masons who are not already Scottish Rite Masons—their numbers in lodges are dwindling, as are ours. I'll wager York Rite is struggling similarly.

Simplistically, it means to us that we have to learn to do with less member support—and that means support in dues, support in degree work, support in working around the building, and the list goes on. EVERYONE is in the same boat—and there are only 24 hours a day—and we're just one of many demands on our members' time.

We're fond of saying "doing the same thing over and over again and somehow expecting the results to be different" is a definition of insanity, YET, despite knowing this, we see signs that we just IGNORE that maxim. Meetings are repetitive, predictable, and still boring to too many of our Brethren. Reality also sometimes is painful—as we all age, we MUST be in a position and willing to hand off governance of the craft to a younger generation—who may or may not see things the same way we do. It doesn't mean they value Masonry less than we do, it just means they see their part in the craft differently—and they believe that COMMUNICATION—with their members, with potential members, and with the public—must take on a different aura (in other words, BE PRESENT where they are—remember, they're not going to come to us, we have to go to them.

History—as shown in the graph a couple of pages ago—tells us that whatever it is we've been doing isn't working. SOMETHING needs to change, perhaps drastically, if we even have a chance of preserving the craft with a semblance of familiarity. Failure to learn from history and change simply means we will continue on that downward slope toward collapse. Change is never easy and rarely painless, but it is essential. In the navy, there is a term "in extremis" which means you have reached a point aboard a ship underway that no matter what you do, you WILL have a collision with another ship." Let's not wait until the craft and Scottish Rite get "in extremis" before we actually try to make meaningful changes to bring in the missing generation of young Masons that will carry the craft beyond that predicted endpoint, because, in extremis, it is already too late..

I'm not saying "the sky is falling" or "we all doomed" - or anything of that ilk. I'm simply saying that while I can enjoy my Masonry, the next generation may find it cannot—and that's not a legacy I would like to leave to them. Let's get together, brainstorm, and start thinking OUTSIDE THE BOX to approach a solution to this problem.

A key purpose of National Sojourners is the advancement of programs that promote love of country. Accordingly, our nationwide chapters stand ready to provide a wide range of complimentary patriotic programs and series in support of interested organizations including: churches, schools, civic groups, veteran associations, youth groups, ROTC/JROTC units. In addition, National Sojourners is deeply committed to serving Masonic Lodges and Appendant Bodies with a wide range of educational programs and services to the craft.

To be an active member, you must be a Master Mason and U.S. citizen having served, or currently serving, honorably in the Uniformed Services of the United States. Those Master Masons who are ineligible for "active" membership but who have served Masonry or the nation meritoriously, are eligible to become honorary members. However, each chapter is limited to a maximum of 15% of its total membership as honorary—but a special waiver of this limit is granted to the elected Grand Lodge Officers if they are otherwise not eligible for regular active membership.

We also have one or two evening meetings—one in November to hear the youth we sponsored to Freedom's Foundation at Valley Forge speak to us about their experiences during the summer.
