**2022 MEMBERSHIP FEE WAS PAYABLE JANUARY 1, 2022.** We currently have 85 members who have not yet paid their 2022 membership fee. Please do your part to help sustain the operation of Denver Consistory by paying your membership fee. If you are experiencing financial difficulty and are unable to pay your membership fee, PLEASE CONTACT ME. We have programs available to assist you so that you are not suspended for nonpayment, BUT YOU MUST CONTACT ME. We can't help you if you don't ask.

**2023 MEMBERSHIP FEE INCREASE** - The Denver Consistory membership fee will be \$130 effective January 1, 2023. Denver Consistory is not immune to the effects of inflation and the increased cost of doing business, which has necessitated the membership fee increase. The Supreme Council will mail the 2023 membership fee notices in August of 2022. Please pay your membership fee when you receive the notice, and not lay it aside and forget about it and then become delinquent.

#### Life Membership Fee:

75 years old and older – a single payment of \$1,000
62-74 years old – a single payment of \$1,500
Younger than 62 – a single payment of \$2,500
Extended payment terms may be arranged. Contact the office for details.

Life Memberships are an ideal way to avoid paying future membership fee increases. A Life Membership guarantees that you will never be suspended for nonpayment should your future financial situation change. It also ensures that should you no longer be able to take care of your finances you will not be suspended for nonpayment because your Scottish Rite Membership is of no significance to the individual handling your finances. By purchasing a Life Mem-

bership you leave a continuing legacy to Denver Consistory after your death.

Monthly membership fee payment is available - Are you tired of paying fees at the end of the year to all the Masonic bodies to which you belong? You may pay your annual Denver Consistory membership fee in eleven easy monthly payments rather than one lump sum, eliminating one more year-end bill to pay. By authorizing an automatic credit card payment each month, at the end of eleven months your membership fee for the ensuing year will be paid. Contact the office to set up a payment plan.

#### **AUTOMATIC MEMBERSHIP FEE RENEWAL PROGRAM**

Supreme Council created and installed an auto-renewal program to pay membership fees. This is a COMPLETELY VOLUNTARY program that gives members the OPTION to have their membership fees automatically deducted using a credit or debit card through the online Membership Portal.



## The Prelate's Pulpit

Rev. James H. Harris, 33° Prelate for All Scottish Rite Bodies



My Brothers, summer is fleeting by us, and soon we will return to all the meetings, etc. that are on our calendars. However, in these days of summer, let us enjoy the time we have with family and friends or to just relax. At the Scottish Rite Masonic Center we will gather for our summer dinner. This has been held in various places, but this year it will be in the coolness at the Consistory. In August, the officers will gather for their annual planning meeting. Then in September, it is "off to the races" so to speak. My wife and I enjoyed the pancake breakfast at Nevadaville Lodge recently. It was great to see the families enjoying the food and the fellowship.

The Scottish Rite Creed says that "Human progress is our cause, liberty of thought and our supreme wish, freedom of conscience our mission, and the guarantee of equal rights to all people everywhere our ultimate goal." These words are in line with the words in our Declaration of Independence which was signed on July 4, 1776.

Time is always fleeting and I often struggle to make good use of my time. The three-legged stool is a good way to think about dividing my time into three parts. Freemasonry is like a three-legged stool in the three attributes which define us and which are the basis of Masonry. They are Brotherly Love, Relief, and Charity. Brotherly Love is that attribute that unites all men. It is the glue that holds us together into one sacred band of friends and brothers. It is the fellowship which keeps us coming back to lodge to be with brethren with whom we share a common experience. We cannot stand alone.

Relief is the attribute of charity to those in need. It is the duty incumbent upon us as men and Masons to be compassionate and soothe the afflictions of those less fortunate. Without contemplation and intellectual pursuits, charity, and fraternalism, we cannot stand together.

Truth, within the context of Freemasonry, is the attribute of self-discovery. It is the casting off of that which diminishes us and our endeavors to improve ourselves through contemplation and intellectual pursuits. It is the study of the symbolism and history of Freemasonry and the application of moral truths.

These three all go together. They all are needed for the lodge to function. Three is an important number: The three degrees of Masonry; the three great lights; the three lesser lights; the three knocks; the three steps to the Master's station; the three Wise Men; the three gifts; the Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; the three Gospels.
